Let him show by good conduct that His works are done in the meekness of wisdom. ¹⁴But if you have bitter envy and self-seeking in your hearts, do not boast and lie against the truth. ¹⁵This wisdom does not descend from above, but is earthly, sensual, demonic. ¹⁶For where envy and self-seeking exist, confusion and every evil thing are there. ¹⁷But the wisdom that is from above is first pure, then peaceable, gentle, willing to yield, full of mercy and good fruits, without partiality and without hypocrisy. ¹⁸Now the fruit of righteousness is sown in peace by those who make peace." We see further in James 4:1-10, where Pride promotes Strife. ¹Where do wars and fights come from among you? Do they not come from your desires for pleasure that war in your members? ²You lust and do not have. You murder and covet and do not obtain. You fight and war. Yes you do not have because you do not ask. ³You ask and do not receive, because you ask amiss, that you may spend it on your pleasures. ⁴Do you not know that friendship with the world is enmity with God? Whoever therefore wants to be a friend of the world makes himself and enemy of God. ⁵Or do you think that the scripture says in vain, "The Spirit who dwells in us yearns jealously"? ⁶But He gives more grace. Therefore, He says: "God resists the proud, but gives grace to the humble." (Proverbs 3:34) ⁷Therefore submit to God. Resist the devil and he will flee from you.⁸Draw near to God and He will draw near to you. Cleanse your hands, you sinners, and purify your hearts, you double-minded. ⁹Lament and mourn and weep! Let your laughter be turned to mourning and your joy to gloom. ¹⁰Humble yourselves in the sight of the Lord, and He will lift you up."

I know these words are harsh and good cause for self-reflection and remorse for past sins. But, most certainly there is hope, which I personally cling to for my past shortcomings in His sight, as well as others. In Ephesians 5:1-2,8-14 we see where there is light and His promise: "¹Therefore be imitators of God, as beloved children. ²And walk in love, as Christ loved us and gave Himself up for us, a fragrant offering and sacrifice to God....⁸For at one time you were in darkness, but now you are light in the Lord. Walk as children of light ⁹(for the fruit of light is found in all that is good and right and true),¹⁰and try to discern what is pleasing to the Lord. ¹¹Take no part in the unfruitful works of darkness, but instead expose them. ¹²For it is shameful even to speak of the things that they do in secret. ¹³But when anything is exposed by the light, it becomes visible, ¹⁴for anything that becomes visible is light. Therefore, it says, "Awake. O sleeper, and arise from the dead, and Christ will shine on you."

Then we also see Jesus' words in John 8:12 "... I am the light of the world. Whoever follows Me will not walk in darkness but will have the light of life." So, as we venture on, let us all seek light and truth and resist evil in all its' many forms.
