Some of us "Aged Enhanced" Legion Family may remember Bill Cosby's Comedy Routine of "Why is there Air". Obviously to fill Basket Balls, but what about us? Why ARE we here? By my Faith, God created all we see around us, in space, on this earth, and everything that is. He also put US here. He put us here to be thankful to Him and to worship Him for His mercy and grace. But did He also do it for us individually for our own self-seeking success, or are we here to live with others and to help others as well?

We learn to the book of Exodus when Moses was leading the Israelites out of their bondage in Egypt to the Promised Land, the God gave them, and us all, the Ten Commandments for us to follow and NOT break our relationship with God and each other. All these things are not how we put ourselves above others, but how we put others before ourselves. Isn't THAT a definition of Love and an example of "Love Thy Neighbor"?

This has little to do with what religion you believe in, or do not believe, which is your choice. It does have to do with showing respect for each other, caring for each other, Loving each other, BEING THE ONE for each other, and helping each other along that path to success for all of our wellbeing. The Freedoms that we have must not be taken for granted, or abused, but cherished and to be worthy of those that have given of their very lives to sustain or Freedoms, and to our God for his mercy and grace that we live in a land of Liberty.

YES, we do have challenges in our American Legion of Washington, but we all must believe in what our Forefathers set before us and be worthy of the sacrifices made to move forward, forgive those things that have led us down a wrong path, and show the Love for each other as God has shown us. Our path is not an easy one, but together, WITH each other, we can and will succeed. If we keep our "Preamble" and "For God And Country" in our hearts and minds, we can be prosperous in helping ourselves and our country and our Veterans and their families.
